The TUHH does not offer any preparatory courses to prepare students for a Master's program.

## Admission Requirements – Formal Requirements, Subject Specific Requirements, Required Grades

To apply for a Master's degree program at the TUHH, you have to fulfill formal and subject specific requirements. For some Master's degree programs the TUHH also requires a Bachelor's degree with good grades.

### Formal requirements

### Subject specific requirements

The Master's degree programs at the TUHH are consecutive Master's degree programs, the content of your Bachelor's degree must match the desired Master's degree program. The subject-specific requirements for the Master's degree programs can be found on the following pages:

### Required grades

- For the **English-language Master's degree programs** (except Computer Science, Electrical Engineering) applicants from non-EU countries need a Bachelor's degree with good grades. To check if the grades of your Bachelor's degree are sufficient for admission please use the precheck: <https://tune.tuhh.de/tusp/precheck/?lang=en> (available from December). If your grades are sufficient for an application, you will receive a precheck-code, which you have to enter in the online application.
- Admission to the Master's degree program in **International Management and Engineering** is restricted! The grades of the Bachelor's degree are relevant for admission. The grades required for admission depend on the number of applicants.

### Admission Requirements - Required Language Proficiency

Depending on whether you are applying for a German, English or bilingual Master's degree program, you will need to prove different language proficiency for the application and, in the case of admission, additionally for enrollment. Please take care of the necessary language certificates in good time!

Only native English speakers from Australia, United Kingdom, Ireland, USA, New Zealand or Canada (except Quebec) or applicants who have completed their full Bachelor's degree in one of these countries do not need a proof of English!

### Application Procedure

Application is possible for the winter semester (start of studies: October 1).

For some Master's degree courses, you can also apply for the summer semester (start of studies: April 1), but this can lead to longer study times. The application periods vary depending on the degree program.

The application takes place online! TUHH doesn't cooperate with uniassist! TUHH does not issue separate confirmations of your application!

If you are applying for an Master's degree program completely taught in English (except Computer Science, Electrical Engineering), you have to take the pre-check before applying online:

<https://tune.tuhh.de/tusp/precheck/?lang=en>. After a successful pre-check, you will receive a pre-check-code and you will be automatically forwarded to the online application.

For the winter semester, you can apply for a maximum of one German-language/bilingual Master's degree program or Computer Science, Electrical Engineering AND one English-language Master's degree program. For the summer semester, you can only apply for one German-language/bilingual Master's degree program or Computer Science, Electrical Engineering.

The selection committee will decide at the earliest 4-8 weeks after receipt of your application on admission. You can find the admission decision in the TUHH applicant portal.

## Required Application Documents

For the online application you have to upload the below listed documents.

If the documents are not in German or English, German or English translations by a sworn translator must also be submitted. The translations alone are not sufficient!

Authenticated documents are not yet required. In case of admission certified documents must be submitted for enrolment. You can find information on authentication here:

Curriculum vitae / résumé (only for the English-language Master's degree programs (except Computer Science, Electrical Engineering))
Complete university transcript of records or provisional transcript
European Diploma Supplement, for graduates from European universities
Bachelor's degree certificate or provisional degree certificate
If you have not yet completed your studies at the time of application, the TUHH needs a prognosis certificate from your university (confirmation concerning the expected date of graduation and the final grade point average). Proof of German language (if required, see page 2 f.)

APS certificate (only for applicants with a school or university degree from China, India or Vietnam, regardless of their nationality)

## NIT/TUHH: Double Degree Program

The NIT/TUHH Double Degree Program enables B.Sc. graduates to complete their studies with a Master of Science in Engineering at the TUHH plus a Master of Arts or MBA in Technology Management at the Northern Institute of Technology Management (NIT). The Double Degree Program is tuition-based.

## Fees, Expenses and Scholarships

### semester contribution

TUHH doesn't charge tuition fees, except for the Master's program G-TIME. Students only have to pay a semester contribution of around €350 per semester. The ticket for public transportation is included in the semester fee. G-TIME-tuition fees: <https://www.g-time.org/fees-and-funding>

### cost of living

The cost of living in Hamburg is rather high. Students should expect to pay at least €950 per month, including accommodation, health insurance and study materials.

### working/jobbing

Studying in Germany cannot be financed by working part-time. On the one hand, the strict organization of studies does not permit this, and on the other hand, students from non-EU countries are only allowed to work a maximum of 120 days (or 240 half days) per year in Germany.

## Visa

Most international applicants from non-EU countries need a visa to enter Germany. To check whether you need a student visa and to obtain further information on applying for a visa, please visit the website of the German Embassy responsible for your place of residence: <https://www.auswaertiges-amt.de/en/aussenpolitik/laenderinformationen>

Applying for a visa takes a long time, so you should apply for a visa as early as possible. Do not enter Germany with a tourist visa or a national residence permit of a Schengen country! If you do, you will have to leave Germany after 90 days and may not re-enter after that!
